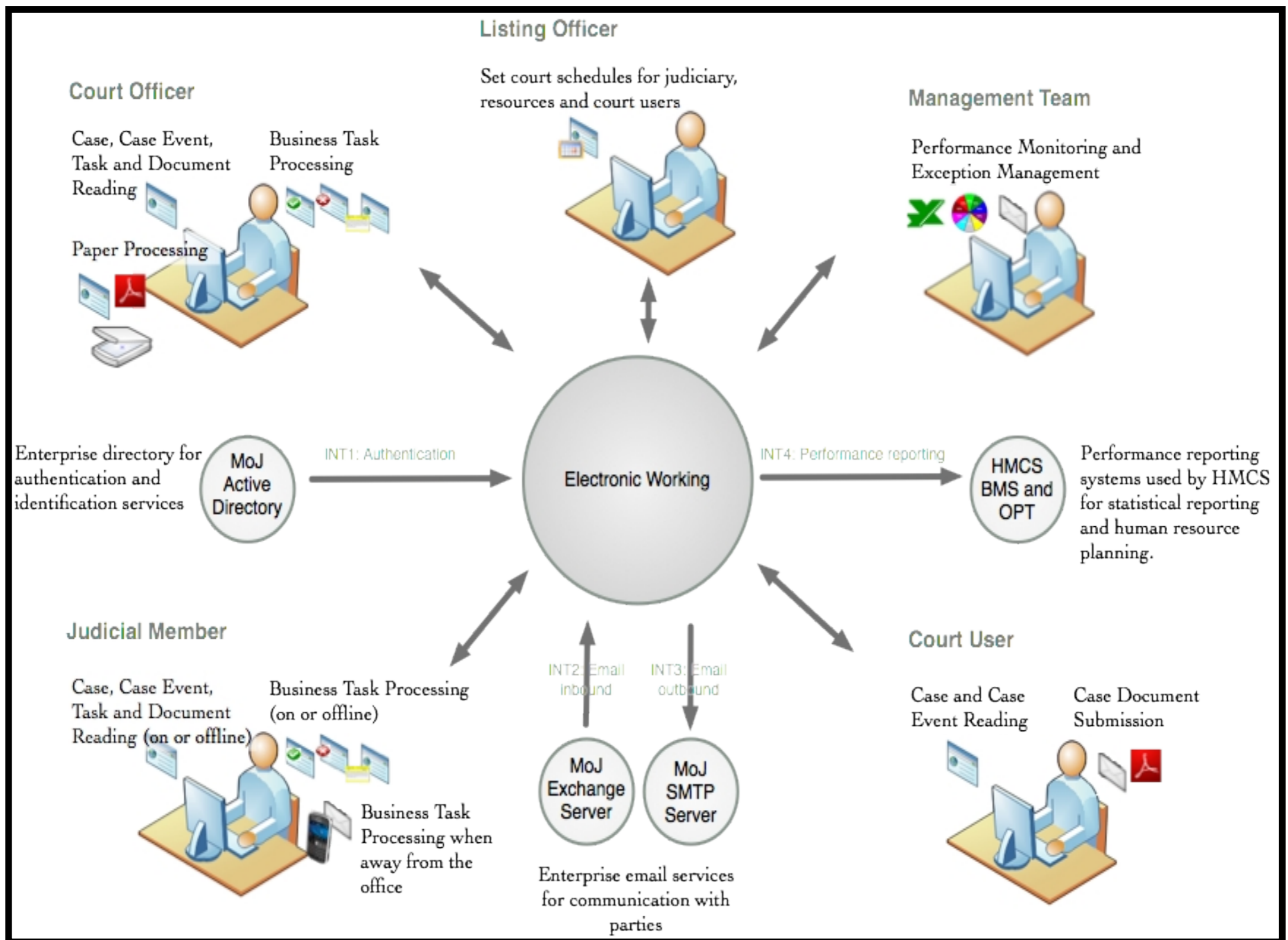

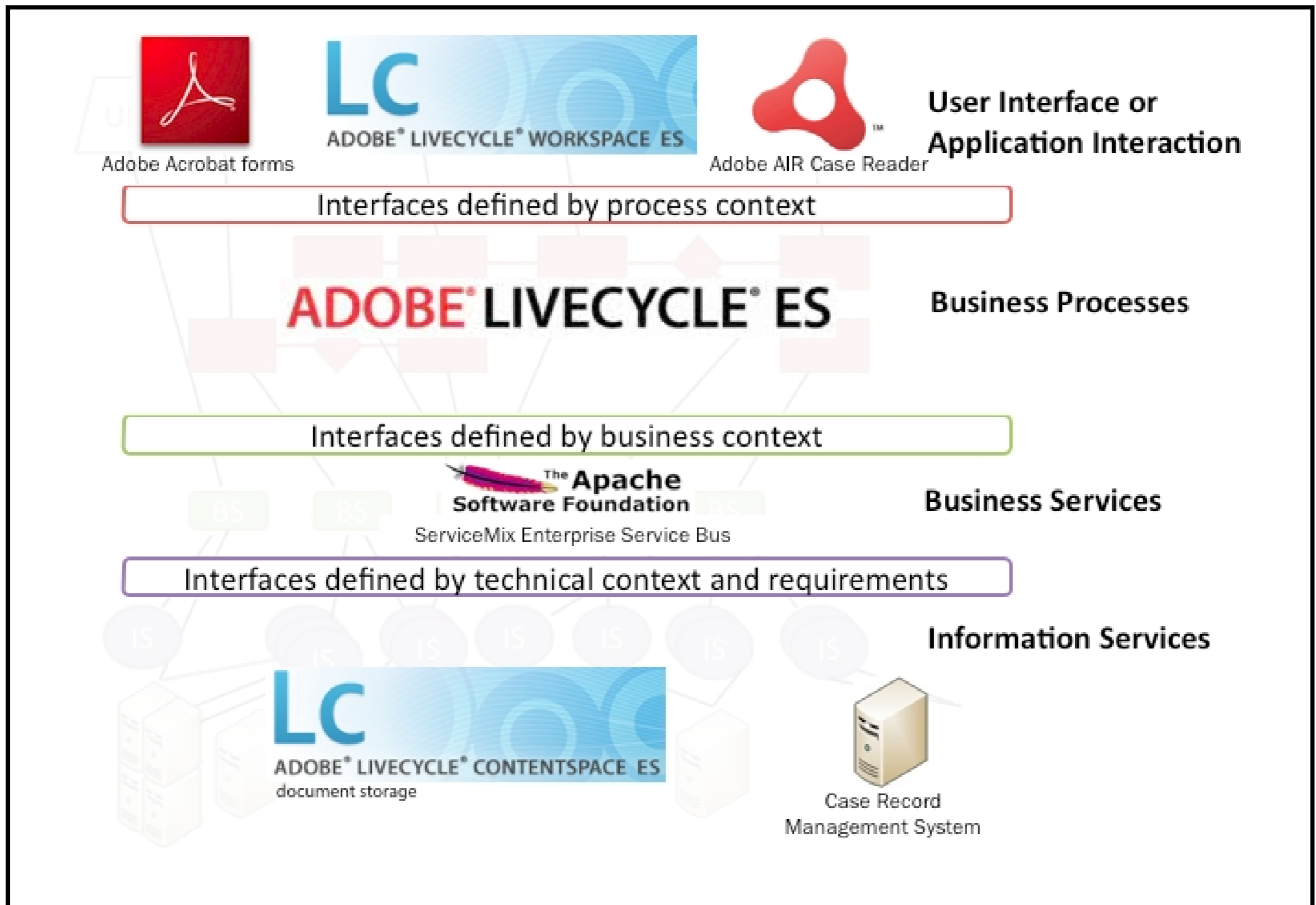

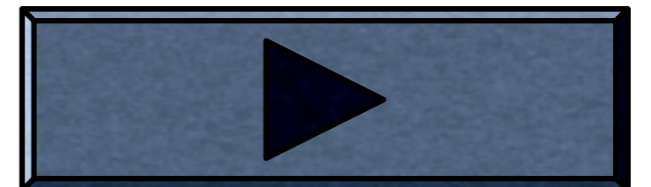
Today's Demo - Companies Winding Up
